emphasis on high-value, low-cost services, the design team employed a minimalist architectural aesthetic, creatively selecting natural materials, exposed structural steel, corrugated metal and glass. The wayfinding system is based on stringent Port Authority of New York and New Jersey standards for the use of colors, materials and typographic specifications.
